A Resolution to recognize, honor and commend Megan C. Hodge for her outstanding performance in the sport of volleyball

1	WHEREAS, Megan Colleen Hodge was born on October 15, 1988, in St. Thomas,
2	Virgin Islands to Michael and Carmen Samuel-Hodge; and
3	WHEREAS, at the age of three, her family relocated to Durham, North Carolina; and
4	WHEREAS, her mother, Carmen Samuel-Hodge, a former member of the U.S. Virgin
5	Islands National Volleyball Team, played volleyball at George Washington University; and
6	WHEREAS, her father, Michael Hodge, also a former member of the U.S. Virgin Islands
7	National Volleyball Team, played volleyball at the University of the Virgin Islands; and
8	WHEREAS, eventually Megan followed in the footsteps of her parents and other
9	relatives by playing the "family sport"; and
10	WHEREAS, at the age of 12, Megan began playing volleyball at Riverside High School;
11	and
12	WHEREAS, Megan's power plays developed to the point where she was one of the most
13	dominant young players in the entire nation; and

2	WHEREAS, Megan holds the distinction of becoming the first player from the Carolina
3	region to be named to the All-Tournament Team at the USA Junior Olympic Girl's Volleyball
4	Championships; and
5	WHEREAS, Megan was voted the Most Valuable Player and "Best Attacker" at the
6	2004 North, Central America and Caribbean (NORCECA) Championships in Catano, Puerto
7	Rico; and
8	WHEREAS, as a student at Riverside High School, Megan was a four time Pac-6 All
9	Conference selection, as well as the Pac-6 Player of the Year twice; and
10	WHEREAS, Megan was selected as the Most Valuable Player of the North Carolina
11	Regional Championships for the 18's Gold Age Division; and
12	WHEREAS, as a junior and a senior in high school, Megan was named the North
13	Carolina Volleyball Gatorade Player of the Year; and
14	WHEREAS, in 2006, Megan was named the Gatorade National Player of the Year for
15	Volleyball, selected from more than 385,000 female high school volleyball players nationwide;
16	and
17	WHEREAS, Megan was nominated as a finalist for the Gatorade Female High School
18	Athlete of the Year Award; and
19	WHEREAS, Megan Hodge was considered the top school recruit for her high school
20	Class of 2006 with over 150 scholarship offers from several universities including volleyball
21	powerhouses Stanford, South California, Washington and Long Beach State;
22	WHEREAS, Megan accepted a full scholarship from Penn State University; and
23	WHEREAS, in her freshman year at Penn State, Megan's performance made her the first
24	freshman to be named Big Ten Player of the Year as well as Big Ten Freshman of the Year in the
25	then 23-year history of the Big Ten; and

2 WHEREAS, Megan holds the distinction of being the first volleyball player to win the 3 Gatorade National Player of the Year and American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) 4 National Freshman of the Year award in consecutive seasons; and 5 WHEREAS, in 2007, Megan Hodge led Penn State to their first NCAA final four 6 appearance since 1999, in which she record a season-high 26 kills and had a key serving string in 7 the decisive fifth game win, serving 6 straight points, which led her to be named the NCAA 8 Championship Most Outstanding Player; and 9 WHEREAS, in 2008, Megan was named the NCAA University Park Regional Most 10 Outstanding Player; and 11 WHEREAS, in 2008, Megan led the Penn State Nittany Lions to their second 12 consecutive NCAA Championship, topping off an undefeated year, and captured the honor of 13 being the NCAA Championship Most Outstanding Player, becoming the third player in NCAA 14 Tournament history to earn the award twice; and 15 WHEREAS, Megan also excelled academically as she was honored as an ESPN The 16 Magazine Second Team Academic All-American in 2008 and later earned the Academic All-17 American of the Year for volleyball; and 18 WHEREAS, Megan was also a three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree; and 19 WHEREAS, Megan was named the 2010 Penn State Female Athlete of the Year; and 20 WHEREAS, Megan won the Honda Award for Women's Volleyball; and 21 WHEREAS, Megan is the first Penn State student athlete to win the prestigious Honda-22 Broderick Award in the school's 155-year history; and 23 WHEREAS, the Honda-Broderick Award is awarded to the Top Collegiate Woman 24 Athlete in the country; and 25

1	WHEREAS, on May 16, 2010, Megan Hodge earned her Bachelor of Science in
2	Business Management from Penn State University, leaving Penn State holding the career record
3	with 4.54 kills per set; and
4	WHEREAS, Megan Hodge moved on to the U.S. Women's National Volleyball Team,
5	which won the silver at the 26 th Annual Montreux Volley Masters in Switzerland and competed
6	at the IX Women's Volleyball Pan American Cup in Mexico; and
7	WHEREAS, Megan competed for Team USA in the 2012 Grand Prix, winning the gold
8	medal and the Most Valuable Player and Best Scorer awards; and
9	WHEREAS, Megan won the silver medal at the 2012 Summer Olympics; and
10	WHEREAS, in 2012, Megan was selected as the Most Valuable Player of the Fédération
11	Internationale de Volleyball (FIVB) World Grand Prix after leading Team USA to a 5-0 record in
12	the Final Round; and
13	WHEREAS, in 2013, in the Pan-American Cup, Megan started all five matches, helping
14	the U.S. to win the second straight Pan-American Cup and also won the Best Spiker Award and
15	the gold medal; and
16	WHEREAS, this Virgin Islands six feet, three inches outside hitter with a vertical reach
17	of 10 feet 8 inches has had a distinguished and stellar volleyball career full of accolades and
18	awards which has distinguished her in the sport from high school to college level to volleyball as
19	a career; Now, Therefore,
20	Be it resolved by the Legislature of the Virgin Islands:
21	SECTION 1. The Legislature of the Virgin Islands, on behalf of the People of the Virgin
22	Islands, recognizes, honors and commends Megan Colleen Hodge for her distinguished and
23	outstanding career in the sport of volleyball.
24	SECTION 2. The President of the Legislature or the President's designee shall present a
25	perma plaque copy of this resolution to Megan Colleen Hodge at an appropriate ceremony.
