An Act amending title 3 Virgin Islands Code, chapter 18 to establish the Virgin Islands Sports Commission and a National Sports Policy within the Department of Sports, Parks and Recreation that would be responsible for regulating sports, recreation, leisure and wellness programs in the Virgin Islands

PROPOSED BY: Senator Myron D. Jackson

WHEREAS, the Legislature declares that it is the intent of this act to ensure that there is established a Virgin Islands Sports Policy for the territory to be administered by a Sports

3 Commission under the auspices of the Department of Sports, Parks and Recreation; and


WHEREAS, it is recognized that in the Virgin Islands there is no coherent wellcoordinated and well organized national sports policy and program for the development and

promotion of individual and team sports, and recreational, leisure and wellness programs in the

1	WHEREAS, there is a need to establish a framework for the development of polices that
2	define the vision, values, strategic directions and objectives that would provide guidance for the
3	development of national sports, recreation, leisure and wellness programs; and

WHEREAS, there has been and continues to be a total absence of appropriate record management of local sports events, including the retention of official records for all organized sports and major recreational events; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for public and private-sector organizers of sport events to begin the process of developing a culture of record management, documentation and retention of all aspects of sports records which would help to preserve the history of sports and recreation in the territory for future generations; and

WHEREAS, there is no national policy that provides guidance for the administration, supervision and conduct of school sports in the Territory; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to improve the delivery of sports and recreational programs, including school sports, throughout the Territory and encourage greater participation of Virgin Islanders in sports, recreation, leisure and wellness programs as a means of enhancing intellectual, physical health and the pursuit of excellent in mind and body, and in order to establish minimum standards for sports, recreation, leisure and wellness programs, and facilities for residents and visitors there is a need to adopt territory-wide guidelines for these programs and their organizers; Now, Therefore,

#### Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Virgin Islands:

- SECTION 1. Title 3 Virgin Islands Code, chapter 18 is amended by designating the existing provisions as subchapter I and adding subchapter II to read as follows:
- 23 "Subchapter Π the Virgin Islands Sports Commission.
  - §311. As used in this subchapter the following terms have the following meaning

16	§312 (	a) There are established within the Department of Sports, Parks & Recreation the
17	Virgin Islands	Sports Commission comprised of:
18		(1) the Commissioner of Sports, Parks and Recreation who serves ex-officio;
19		(2) the president of the Virgin Islands Olympic Committee;
20		(3) three representatives from the Virgin Islands Sports Federations,
1	recom	nended by the Virgin Islands Olympic Committee, who rotate among the
22	federa	ions every three years;
13		(4) the Commissioner of the Department of Education, or a designated
4	represe	ntative:

1	(5) the Commissioner of the Department of Tourism, or a designated
2	representative;
3	(6) the Chief Executive Officer of the Virgin Islands Economic Development

12	representatives of the VI Sports Federations shall begin with two year terms and thereafter serve
13	three terms. The representative from the private sector shall begin their terms as a three term.
L4	§313 Powers and Duties of the commission. The Commission shall:
15	(1) Develop and enforce all laws s and policies that govern sports and recreation in
16	the Virgin Islands;
<b>L</b> 7	(2) Facilitate the establishment and maintenance of a Virgin Islands Sports Hall of

19	(3) Induct athletes, administrators into the Virgin Islands Sports Hall of Fame based
20	on appropriate criteria established by regulations promulgated by the Commission;
21	(4) Make recommendations for the honoring of sports achievers in ways other than
22	induction into the Hall of Fame;
23	(5) Establish policies and guidelines for training and selecting Virgin Islands elite and

- Act as an arbitrator either by itself or by persons duly appointed by it to deliberate on matters affecting sports, recreation, leisure and wellness programs in the Territory and to advise the Government on the implementation of the National Sports Policies;
- 6 (8) Identify locations and advise on the establishment, use, and maintenance of playing facilities in the territory;
- 8 (9) Include for activities for children, youth, adults, senior citizens, and the 9 challenged;
  - (10) Offer coaching development opportunities;

- 11 (11) Recommend to the Government and the VI Olympic Committee areas of priority 12 for providing funds for training and the development of personnel and athletes;
  - (12) Generate and administer funds for the administration of the Sports Commission through programs and fees generated from sports tourism programs and activities;
  - (13) Serve as a link between local non-Olympic sports associations/organizations, the Virgin Islands Olympic Committee, local sports federations, inter-scholastic sports and organized recreational and wellness programs;
- 18 (14) Recommend to the National Hall of Fame Committee, persons who are deserving
  19 of national awards;
- 20 (15) Provide assistance to sports, recreational and other related organizations where 21 possible; such assistance will be based on accountability and proper management systems;
- 22 (16) Set and monitor standards to guide athletes and sports development in areas such 23 as safety, health, conditions, etc.;

#### 8 §314. Virgin Islands sports policy.

- (a) The Commission shall develop and publish a National Sports Policy that serves as the framework for the development, guidance and administration of sports, recreation, leisure and wellness programs in the Territory.
- (b) The Commission shall administer sports policies and has oversight responsibility for the regulation and enforcement of all matters related to the implementation and management of the National Sports Policy.
- (c) The Commission shall adhere to the United Nations Inter-Agency Task Force on Sport for Development and Peace that adapted the following definition of Sport:
- "All forms of physical activities that contribute to physical fitness, intellectual and economic well-being; as well as social interaction, such as play, recreation, organized or competitive sport, indigenous sport and games."
- (d) The Commission shall adhere to the United Nations Inter-Agency Task Force on Sport for Development adoption of the following policy: "Sport for Development and Peace: Towards Achieving the Millennium Development Goals, outlines the universal appeal and unique attributes of sport and reflects on the important and diverse role it plays in virtually every society."

1	§ 315. Strategy plan. The Commission shall establish from its inception a five or ten-
2	year strategy master plan with a vision statement, mission statement, and policy objectives.
3	Until the Commission adopts a new vision and mission statement and policy objectives, the
4	following vision statement, mission statement, and policy objectives are in effect:
5	(d) Vision Statement: To create a Virgin Islands society in which the residents
6	participate in sports, recreation and leisure activities for all while building relationships with
7	individuals inside and outside of their communities and enhancing individual personal wellbeing.
8	(2) Mission Statement: The Mission of the National Sports Policy Statement is to
9	provide guidance for the development of the Virgin Islands into a leading sports country in the
10	region and the rest of the world.

- (3) Policy Objectives: This national sports policy is intended to serve as a vehicle to a new era in the development and administration of sports, recreation and leisure events that would improve the sports performance of individuals locally and internationally and the physical wellbeing of Virgin Islanders.
  - §316. The Major Aims of the Virgin Islands Sports Commission are to:
- 16 (1) Improve programming to ensure that sports are accessible, equitable and inclusive 17 to meet the needs and interests of all participants, including individuals with special needs.
  - (2) Increase participation in competitive, recreational and leisure sports and activities.
  - (3) Increase students' participation and graduation rates.

- (4) Increase appreciation for the cultural values of the Virgin Islands, the values of fair play, ethical practices, including a commitment to dope-free sports and leadership among all participants.
- 23 (5) Increase enhanced health, wellness and prosperity for all.

.5	efficiency in implementing programs, training and development opportunities which must be
6	provided to sports practitioners. To attain these ideals, the Commission shall give attention to
17	development of human resources and to the following:
8	(1) establishment of a program for the provision of technical support for
.9	approved national sporting bodies on an agreed criterion;
20	(2) Providing scholarships for sports persons to allow for exposure at a higher
11	level of performance and to encourage professional development through education;

- §320. The Commission shall encourage the wider coverage and promotion of sports activities and shall undertake to advocate for:
- 8 (1) Increase in the publicity and exposure to sporting activities that highlight the 9 endeavor of our sports persons and to stimulate public support and participation;
  - (2) Assurance that all media houses play an active role in promoting sports as a healthy lifestyle and encourage the participation of all;
  - (3) National sport organizations and affiliates to undertake marketing and promotional activities aimed at increasing and sustaining spectator attendance at sporting activities;
    - (4) Educational activities to be developed to instruct the general public about the rules and skills of different sporting disciplines;
- 17 (5) Media houses to be encouraged to record sporting events and develop structured 18 sports programs; and
- 19 (6) Media houses must pay due regard to the rights of the sporting bodies for their 20 events.

- The Commission shall advocate for high standards and safety, and improved performance as part of a National Sports Policy. The Sports Policy must seek to ensure that:
- 4 (a) Facilities of an acceptable standard are established to allow for the development 5 of a range of sports disciplines;
  - (b) A proper system of management is established for the management and maintenance of sporting facilities;
- 8 (c) Government ensures the availability of recreational space at schools, communities
  9 and housing developments; and
  - (d) A special package of incentives is provided to the private sector for the establishment of sporting infrastructure.
- 12 §323. Promoting sports within the private sector.
- 13 (a) The Commission shall promote a supportive atmosphere that inspires and 14 facilitates the emergence of elite performers. The Commission shall encourage greater 15 recognition to sports personalities and administrators by Government, national sporting bodies 16 and affiliates, the private sector and community organizations.
  - (b) The Commission shall work towards national representatives and teams to have free access to all facilities to prepare for approved international competitions;
  - (c) Special consideration must be given to outstanding national sports representatives to assist in securing employment and other benefits;
    - (d) All departments, agencies and instrumentalities of the Government of the Virgin Islands shall cooperate with the Commission in implementing the Virgin Islands Sports Policy.
- §324. If there is a conflict between this subchapter and other law, this subchapter controls.

2	This bill establishes the Virgin Islands Sports Commission which is responsible for the
3	creation and development of a national sports policy within the guidelines established in this bill.
